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**Granite State Cycles Start Clinics To Teach Children How To Ride
Bikes Safely**

BEDFORD, NH, DECEMBER 5, 2024 – Today, Granite State Cycles announces that they will open clinics in Manchester and Nashua, NH, on April 20, 2025 at 10 AM to noon to teach children how to ride bikes safely and with proper equipment.

The Manchester clinic will be held at the Southern New Hampshire University Belknap Hall parking lot on 2500 North River Rd. The Nashua clinic will be held at the store location on 14 Broad Street.

The free clinics are open to children six-12 years of age. They will talk about wearing helmets, riding in bike lanes, and using proper hand signals.

They will test out their new skills on the Granite State Cycles Obstacle Course. These tests can include things as riding down a “road,” or a trained dog may try to distract the rider, etc. They will be briefed on what they did well and what may need improvement. They will also receive a certificate of accomplishment.

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Granite State Cycles emphasizes good bicycle safety strongly. President of Granite State Cycles, Summer Pedal, states “We believe bicycle safety is crucial for children.” The master rider also says “With just a little guidance, children can learn habits and rules that could save their lives. Those of us in the bicycle business want to ensure that children who use our products do so competently and safely... And we want to make learning fun.”

Granite State Cycles staff members will attend the event and check each child's bicycle for safe operation. They will indicate these safety requirements on a check-off list and show any equipment that needs repair.
